Technical Assistance

- Provided to Planning Partnerships and local communities
- 18 projects completed/underway
- How is assistance used?
 - Comprehensive plan updates
 - Code review; advice on code implementation
 - Drafting of code language
 - Specific topics: Review of RFPs for consultants,
 PUDs, stream corridor protection



Incentives: Examples

- Technical assistance
 - Priority given to communities with an endorsed BG Plan
 - Education and technical workshops
- Lake Erie Protection Fund
 - Small grants used as a stepping stone for larger grants
 - Chagrin River WPP- stormwater retrofits
 - Friends of Big Creek- stormwater retrofits



Incentives: Examples

- Infrastructure Loan Discount: City of Delaware
 - .5% discount on loan for a new water treatment plant
 - Savings of over \$2.1 million
