Jeff DeLuca, the manager of the Metroparks Brookside and Big Creek Reservations, was on hand to help out in the collection of garbage and debris picked up by the 40 volunteers.

Members of the CLE Peach Photography Environmental Action Clean Up Hiking Group were also part of the effort.

Marco's Pizza in Brooklyn and Guys Pizza Company in Parma donated sheets of pizza for lunch.
