## Group is promoting a cleaner watershed

BROOKLYN — A healthier Cuyahoga River and Lake Erie.

That would be the result of work by advocates who want a healthy Big Creek and a healthy West Creek.

The latter are tributaries of the Cuyahoga. Given that each channels water that flows from roads and parking lots, the task is to find ways to hold and the filter that water before it flows to the river and the lake.

The group Friends of Big The group Friends of Big Creek is promoting public un-derstanding of the challenge by sponsoring hiking tours of wetlands, such as that of West Creek, held at 6:30 p.m. Oot. 5 at West Creek Reservation, off of Ridgewood Drive, Parma, between Broadview and State roads.
